



The final products are usually enhanced with feathers, fur, shells, pearls, copper, and leather.

# ACTIVISM IN AMERICA - 1955 TO 2018

#### EUGENICS: CONTROLLED BREEDING



Eugenics programs carried out by governments have been termed genocide and ethnic cleansing. Dr. Suzanne Rausch will lead a timely presentation and discussion on genetic improvement of a species by controlled breeding. The class examines eugenics in two sessions. Session one examines eugenics in the broad sense and discusses the implications of embryo selection. The second session connects to historical evidence of a eugenics program involving forced sterilization in the United States under the Eugenics Movement of the 1930s.
