The Spanish artist Pablo Picasso was exceptionally gifted. His career spanned most of the 20th century and changed our way of seeing. His exceptional gifts were apparent from earliest childhood. By the time he settled in Paris in 1904, he had produced outstanding works, including those from his Blue Period and Rose Period. In 1907 he shocked the world with his first Cubist painting. Picasso outraged the world with his revolutionary and new visions. His varied lifestyle encompassed a number of locations, several wives, mistresses and children and a series of deep friendships with other artists, poets, and writers.

Paul Gauguin is known for his extended voyages to the exotic islands of Tahiti and the Marquesas, and was described by those who knew him as a querulous, hard drinking individual. Unable to find the paradise he dimly remembered from early childhood, he created his own vision in art, but only at the cost of self-destruction.

SANTIAGO CALATRAVA: THE POETICS OF MOVEMENT



Santiago Calatrava, the Spanish architect whose practice is based in Swizerland, and whose style has been identified as universal. has developed a unique sense of architectural morphology that overlaps structure with what some have expressed as a sense of poetic movement. His designs of bridges, airport terminals, railway stations and art museums are revolutionary, combining a sense of opposing asymmetrical forces with mass that elicit emotional responses from their viewers. Calatrava's most recent work in the United States, the 2016 PATH Transportation Hub in NYC, is a gleaming white asymmetrical structure near Ground Zero and 50 feet below it links New Jersey, Manhatten and John F. Kennedy International Airport.


